Aastuen Open House



Christmas Eve Offering

The Administrative Council has decided that this year's Christmas Eve offering will be given in support of the weekend/school break food for the students in need at Wyoming Elementary School. WUMC started supplying food packages last May. Currently we send breakfast & lunch food for 26 students through the Rangers Supporting Rangers program insuring that students have something to eat when school is not in session. Without weekend/school break food, school nurses see many, many student in their offices on Monday with stomach aches. Their stomachs ache because they haven't had enough to eat over the weekend! This is hunger right down the street from our doors - hunger that will prevent children from learning along with contributing to many other developmental problems. The cost to provide the food for the weekend food packs is approximately \$3000 for the school year. Please give generously this Christmas Eve! If you will be out of town & will miss the collection of this special offering, checks can be written anytime: mark them FOOD PACKS. Food is a basic need. Supplying money for food is a direct expression of our love for God and our savior Jesus Christ. Thank you for your gift!

Christmas Concert


