A Way Forward

Some of you may have heard about the commission called A Way Forward that was formed following our 2016 United Methodist General Conference. The General Conference, with United Methodist representatives from across the globe, is the decision-making body of the United Methodist Church and meets every four years. They appointed a commission to study the church's LGBTQ inclusion.

With an emphasis on the values of unity, grace, and mission, the commission recently presented to the Council of Bishops three models for a way forward:

1. Affirming the current Book of Discipline language with an emphasis on accountability.
2. Removing restrictive language from the Discipline, while protecting the rights of those whose conscience will not allow them to perform same gender weddings or ordain LGBTQ people.
3. Emphasizing unity among United Methodists around doctrine, services and Council of Bishops, while creating different branches that have clearly defined values such as accountability, contextualization and justice.

The Holy Spirit guides this entire process and we have been asked to pray for the Commission and all church leaders as they go through this process of discernment. Our own Bea Z. was asked to write a prayer that was circulated to all Minnesota United Methodists recently. Her prayer:

Gracious and loving God,

We come before you with joy in our hearts and filled with the love of Jesus. We humbly bow before you in gratitude for our many blessings while also hurting for those who are lonely, discouraged, living on the fringes, feeling unworthy, needing your love and peace and strength and the hope that comes from knowing Jesus as Savior and Lord.

As we, your people, seek to serve you, loving God, open our eyes and our hearts. Show us how to graciously accept all our brothers and sisters, nudge us with your Spirit to accept, to act, to love, to bring hope to the hopeless and food and nurture to the hungry. May we always remember that all are loved by you, Jesus, and we are called to love accordingly. In Jesus' name, amen.

A note from Shirley F:

My daughter invited me to attend a meeting with her. She is a member of Fairmont Avenue United Methodist. The meeting was titled "A Way Forward." This meeting was a revelation to me. I'm not sure if I was too busy with major changes in my life or if what was going on in the larger church just did not make it out here to the suburbs.

I learned that at the last General Conference major splits in the body of the church were uncovered and there was talk of churches breaking away. The differences concerned the LGBT community and the churches' responses to this community.

In an effort to avoid a split in United Methodism, the Council of Bishops were asked to convene a Commission on A Way Forward. This commission was established and has been meeting. The members represent every segment of the global church. They will present their report to the Council of Bishops. The Council will then present the report at a special General Conference in February 2019.

The meeting I attended was led by Bishop Ough. We started late since so many more people came than were expected. More chairs were set up and the room was full. After the bishop's presentation, we met in small groups. My daughter had told me that her church was a Reconciling Congregation, which means that they are a congregation that welcomes the LGBT community to worship with them.

It has always been my feeling that in our church locally and throughout the world we may have differences of opinion on things, but we can all worship & fellowship together. I do not want to see our global church split. I think we need to come together—not pull away. I hope you will join me in prayer for the members of the commission as they work toward that goal. (If you have any questions or want to discuss this with Shirley, she is glad to talk with you any time.)
