

From the Pastor...

Have you noticed? This year Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday share the celebrations with other holidays. Ash Wednesday was on February 14, Valentine's Day, and Easter is on April 1, April Fools' Day. The last time this happened it was 1945. The next time it will happen is 2029.

Because of the way that the date of Easter is figured every year (the first Sunday after the first full moon following the vernal equinox) combined with the added factor of Leap Year every four years, this rare occurrence is something that most of us will only see once or twice (or, if you were born in the right time frame, three times) in our lifetimes.

What can we say about this confluence of events? Do these coincidences matter? Neither Valentine's Day nor April Fools' Day are a part of the Christian calendar, but when Valentine's Day coincides with a day of remembering that we are all mortal, what do we do with that? Some people have given us a way to laugh at the coincidence—candied hearts with 'You are dust' and '2 dust u shall return'—some have pointed to the love God shows us by enabling us to know that we are mortal, that we will all die, that this life is a gift to treasure while we have it.

And what about the foolishness of Easter? We won't say "Christ is risen. April fools!" But we do know at some level how foolish those first Christians must have seemed to everyone they talked to about Jesus' resurrection from the dead. 'How could this happen?' 'Why would they say such a thing?' 'Are these people crazy?'

The foolishness of Christ is wiser than the wisdom of humans and we are reminded of that especially this Easter. What a foolishly extravagant God we follow, who gives love without expectation of return, who allows an only Son to be killed by evil to bring about a greater good.

I hope that you will be one of the foolish many who celebrate the resurrection of Christ on Easter Sunday and you will be one of the joyful fools who, on the Sunday following Easter, celebrate the resurrection laugh that puts death in its rightful place—as something that has no power over those who believe in Christ.

"We preach Christ crucified, which is a scandal to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles. But to those who are called...Christ is God's power and God's wisdom. This is because the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength." (1 Corinthians 1:23-25)

Pastor Holly set up at a table inside The Nesting Grounds bright and early on Ash Wednesday morning and for the next three hours she administered ashes and prayed with people and gave them a prayer card that contained church information as well as a prayer for them to pray throughout lent. Administering ashes to those ages 1 to 81, by the end of the morning, seventeen people had come through to receive the mark of the cross. Sharing ash with three additional people in quilting and twelve more at the service that evening, a total of 32 people were blessed by this Wyoming United Methodist Ash Wednesday ministry.

March is Minnesota FoodShare Month

Since 1982, March has been selected as the month to *fill the food shelf shelves*. Donations are typically down during March so this is an opportunity for us to help alleviate hunger. Sadly, for the first time in history over 1/2 of the public school students in America are from low-income families. Three out of four public school teachers report they see students regularly come to school hungry. Wyoming UMC has partnered with Wyoming Elementary School to provide funds and packing volunteers for weekend food to go home with students in need. If we collect funds during March for this program, a percentage of the funds we raise will be doubled! Mark your check (written to WUMC) or envelope with the word "Food" and it will be directed to this mission program. Your money will go a long way as the food shelf can buy 7-10X more food than we can as they purchase their food from Second Harvest.
