

From the Pastor...

I'm looking forward to the month of May!

I'm grateful that we've passed the one-year mark (actually, one year and two months) for gathering every Sunday in person in our worship space. Though we can't tell if we have emerged from COVID until it is in the rearview mirror, it is good to be gathering more frequently with more and more people as time goes on.

I'm also looking forward to gathering with all my colleagues from across Minnesota on May 24 and 25 at the St. Cloud Convention Center. Denny and I will be our congregation's representatives at this annual event that we haven't had in person for three years (and Nancy will be there, too)!

I hope you are planning to be at our vote on our Inclusion Statement following worship on May 15. Our statement is: "All are welcome—people of all ages, ethnicities, abilities, sexual orientations, gender identities—to fully participate in all aspects of our hometown church with a global connection." Our District Superintendent, Susan Nienaber, will be with us on this important day. In last month's "From the Pastor" I outlined some of the steps we have taken over the last three years to get to where we are today.

It is also exciting to have the summer months in view. Because I had anticipated that I would take some time this spring to go on the second of the three journeys funded by the grant we got in 2020 from Lilly Endowment, I have some vacation days stored up that I need to use before July 1 (the beginning of what we call in the United Methodist Church "the appointment year.") I had planned to take three weeks in New Mexico at Ghost Ranch, but things didn't work out. So instead, in May, I will be taking one week of Continuing Education and one week of vacation, allowing all of us to hear Denny Hebrink and Linda Richnofsky preach.

Sunday, May 22, I will be at a former church that I served (Aldersgate, in St. Louis Park) as they "decommission" the church building in anticipation of their moving to shared space with Spirit of Christ Lutheran Church just a mile down the road from their current building. The Aldersgate building site will be a new site for 114 affordable apartments, some much needed living space in that part of town.

Thank you, church, for being church in our community as we continue to partner in our mission of Building Bridges to Christ's Love.

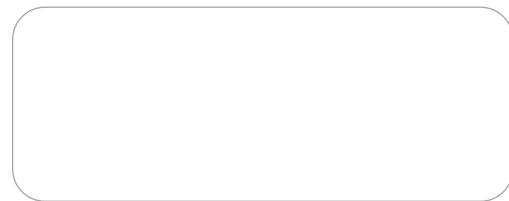
Walk For Water
