



From the Pastor...

I recently had a prompt on my daily health and well-being app that said: "Friendships play an important role in our physical and emotional health. Few things are more gratifying than reconnecting with old friends. Friendships reduce stress, boost self-confidence and increase our sense of purpose. It's never too late to reconnect."

As we begin our fall programming, we need to reconnect. It's been several years since we've been able to safely gather in the fall, and now we have that opportunity to once again safely gather.

One of the weekly devotional email newsletters I subscribe to shared the story a couple of weeks ago about a man who was suicidal. He was a former Navy officer and had been out of the service for a few years. He was living with his mother and suffering from PTSD. He decided to climb out on the ledge of a building and jump until he was talked down off the ledge by a police negotiator.

"I want to thank you for your service," the negotiator said. "I imagine it has cost you deeply. As a cop, I can understand that. Sometimes you just need a hug, you know? You just need to be reminded that you're not alone in the world. I could use a hug right now, in fact. I bet you could, too."

After a moment of hesitation, the young man took the police officer's hand and together they climbed through the window to safety. Once they were on solid ground, they gave each other a hug.

Without connection to each other, we lose something essential about being human. Our health suffers. Our minds play tricks on us. We lose ourselves. A friend who is in recovery from addiction often says, "The opposite of addiction isn't sobriety. The opposite of addiction is community."

We need each other. We need a community like the church that reminds us that we aren't alone, that we are in this together, that the one who gave us life also loves us beyond measure. While much of society seems bent on driving us apart, we see as a church community so much that pulls us together. We are bound together by the love of God and the mission to reach out to those in need as we together build bridges to Christ's love.

Come. You are welcome and wanted. We need each other.




Join the Choir!


STAGECOACH DAY 2022

Kick Off Sunday this year is Sunday, September 11. It's the kick off to our fall season programming and a celebration of all that is beginning, including some ministries that haven't been in place since March of 2020! These days we are starting Sunday School with all the kids sitting up front with the Sunday School teacher as we begin our worship with the Children's Message.
